

## Message from the Co-Show Chairs

We are getting ready for our 2019 Gourd Art and Craft Show - "Gourds in Black & White". This year's show will be at the Fulton county Historical Society, Richland Center Memorial Hall, Rochester, Indiana 46975 (4 miles north of Rochester, on West side of US 31.)

We are again looking for people to participate in our 2019 show:

\*We need volunteers to man tables and help in other areas.

\*We need everyone to enter their gourds in the competition and/or an exhibit.

\*We need for everyone to promote the show by "talking it up".

\*We need items donated for the Silent Auction and Ways and Means table.

\*We want everyone to come and have a good time, showing, selling, learning more and talking gourds.

Once again this year there will be NO SHOW ON SUNDAY.

Thursday will be for set-up day and competition placement only. Open to the public on Friday (10 AM-7:30 PM) and Saturday (10 AM – 4 PM) with everything going on. We will be having a Fellowship Breakfast, on the grounds, Saturday at 8:30 AM. Everyone is welcome. A registration form is in this book.

Competition placement will be on Thursday (2-8 PM) and Friday (7 - 10 AM.) The judges' meeting will be on Friday (10 AM), followed by competition judging until completed. (Competition area will be closed during judging.)

The children's competition classes had many great entries last year. This year, we are continuing with many fun classes for kids; check them out in Division 7. We also welcome all groups of kids; Schools, Scouts, 4H, etc. If you would like to be a part of our show, let us know and we will find ways to supply small gourds and help with misc. supplies. If you have any suggestions on how we can make our shows more exciting to kids, please let us know.

WARNING: <u>Please read the show book very carefully and pay close attention to the show</u> <u>and competition rules</u>: Your entry could be marked down by the judges, if you do not follow the requirements. Make sure you put your entry in the right class. Some classes require a 3 x 5 card to define gourd type or other information. Make sure you have one if needed. <u>Entry tags MUST be attached to your gourd entry.</u>

2019 will be the 7<sup>th</sup> annual Vendor's Competition for the Joyce Dankowski Memorial Award, "Best Vendor Display". We would like to congratulate the 2018 winner, "Sheryl Scott" of Front Porch Gourds, for her impressive display last year. Good luck to all our 2019 vendors.

There will be some <u>Workshops and Make-It- Take- It classes</u> at the 2019 show. They will be listed on our website <u>indianagourdsociety.org</u> in January, and in our January 2019 *Tendril*. Please keep checking our website for updated information.



### **General Rules For Exhibiting**

### **Entry Level Definitions:**

- **<u>Children</u>: # levels** categorize by years old: **#1** (1-4), **#2** (5-8), **#3** (9-12), **#4** (13-18).
- **<u>Children</u>**: May also enter as an adult, in any class in Division 1-6 as:

Novice (N), Intermediate (I), Advanced (A), Masters (M).

### Schools, Youth Org., Groups:

**# levels** categorize by years old: **#1** (1-4), **#2** (5-8), **#3** (9-12), **#4** (13-18). This Class is reserved for Schools, Youth Org., Groups to enter as a group of 2 to 5 children.

- \*\* If this is your first gourd show, that does not automatically make you a novice, see skill levels below:
- <u>Novice</u>: Entrant is at beginning skill level of a technique or class/category. Has not won a blue ribbon in that technique or class/category at art, craft or gourd shows. Does not sell any art or craft work or teach classes for money.
- Intermediate: Entrant is beyond beginning skill level of a technique or class/ category. Has won blue ribbon(s) at art, craft or gourd shows, but not a best of class/category/show/level. May or may not sell art or craft work or teach classes.
- <u>Advanced</u>: Entrant has won multiple ribbons at intermediate level, and has won at least one (1) best of class/category/show/level. Sells art or craft work at shows and/or teaches classes.
- <u>Master</u>: Entrant has won multiple ribbons in best of class/category/level, at least one (1) people's choice, chairman's award, or best of show or level. Sells art or craftwork at shows or in galleries. Teaches art or craft classes on a regular basis.
- <u>All Entrants</u>: Entrant may only **regress** one (1) level if entering a new technique or class/category.

<u>General Exhibitor Entry Guidelines:</u> See specific rules for each division.

- Any individual may exhibit at the Indiana Gourd Show.
- Exhibitors may enter two (2) entries per person per class (except where noted).
- You may display pictures showing construction of your entry to verify gourd use.
- DO NOT MAIL EXHIBIT(S) TO IGS.
- IGS WILL NOT MAIL BACK EXHIBIT(S) LEFT AT THE SHOW.
- Entries exhibited in previous Indiana Gourd Society, Inc. State Shows will not be allowed in the **same** category (class) a second time, but may be entered in a different category.
- Pumpkins, squash, etc. will <u>not</u> be acceptable entries in any show competition.
- Any class assigned a measured space **MUST BE PRE-REGISTERED by April 15.**
- Walk-in entries are accepted on Thursday and Friday, provided staging space is available. Some exhibit classes are pre-registered ONLY and closed to walk-ins.
- Placing walk-in entries may be delayed; tags and summary cards must be printed. This delay could take you past the entry placement deadline of Friday, 10:00 AM.

## **General Rules For Exhibiting**

• Exhibit Summary Card must be shown to pick up exhibits.

### Exhibitor Packet Pick-up

• Hours are 2-8 PM on Thursday and 7 - 10 AM on Friday.

### Exhibit Placement

- <u>Exhibit placement is Thursday 2- 8 PM and Friday 7 10 AM.</u>
- Entry tags provided in exhibitor's packet. <u>Tags must be <u>ATTACHED</u> to each entry</u>.
- Judging begins promptly at 10:00 AM on Friday and ends when completed. (*During this time, the exhibit area will be CLOSED to all except authorized individuals.*)
- Signed gourds may be displayed, but names must be discreetly covered (Artist's name may influence judging).
- Please remove all other tags, including price tags.
- The Show Committee reserves the right to subdivide and/or combine classes.
- The Show Committee reserves the right to relocate exhibits before judging begins.
- The Show Committee members will assist placing entries requiring "special staging." (See entry form)
- Be sure your artistic work <u>fits the class</u> you have entered. If you are unsure, please ask one of the Show Committee Members <u>before</u> placing your entry.

#### Judging

- Judging will be to AGS rules, option "C" for ALL classes. See the AGS Website for explanation of the rules, or contact the IGS Judging Chair (Page 3) for more information or clarification.
- Placements will be 1st through 5th place.
- A single entry in a class does NOT guarantee a 1st place ribbon.
- Judging Teams will place the blue ribbons on the 1st place exhibits in all classes.
- Judging Teams will indicate the award position on the exhibit card for awards given.
- Judging Teams will place ribbons on all Children and School exhibits.
- Exhibitors wishing a ribbon may take the card to the awards table and pick up the ribbons awarded.
- All judges' decisions are final.
- Terminology, as defined in "Glossary of Terms" (P. 9) forms the basis for judging. **Post-Judging**
- Exhibitor's Name shown on entry tag. (Small business cards may be <u>neatly</u> displayed <u>beside</u> entries. Cards may not be placed until **after** judging.)
- Exhibits, ribbons and tags must remain in place until 4:00 PM on Saturday.
- Exhibitors removing exhibits early may not be allowed to exhibit in future IGS shows.
- All <u>unclaimed exhibits</u> become the property of the IGS at Show's close.

### Show Security and Disclaimer

- The Indiana Gourd Society, Inc. and the Fulton Co. Historical Society will provide <u>reasonable</u> security for all participants during the Show.
- The Indiana Gourd Society, Inc. and Fulton Co. Historical Society will <u>not</u> assume responsibility for damage, theft or injury during the Show.

### Awards

### Show Basics - How to Measure

#### Awards Given For:

- The top five (5) entries in each Class. (If the entries merit that placement)
- The Honey Bear and Mary Miller Memorial Award: for Most Competition Entries
- The Most Blue Ribbons. To person having the highest total blue ribbons won
- The IGS Jim Story Award. The three (3) first place winners will compete for a 1st, 2nd and 3rd place cash award of \$25, \$15 and \$5, provided by Jane Story. The best of these three (3) will be eligible to enter the AGS level competition.
- The IGS Jim Story Award. A ribbon and Includes eligibility at AGS level.
- The Jim & Jane Story Creative Floral Design: The 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place winners will be given cash awards of \$25, \$15, and \$5, provided by Jane Story.
- Best of Level Awards: Will be selected from ALL Division 5's, 1st place winners in each level. One (1) Best of level Award will be given in each level. (N, I, A, M)
- **Best of Division Awards:** Will be selected from ALL 1st place winners in Divisions 1-2-3-4-5-6.
- **Chairperson's Award :** Will be selected by the Show Chair and Committee and will be determined at the end of judging.
- **People's Choice Award:** Will be selected by public vote on Friday & Saturday and be presented on Saturday at 2:30 PM.

(In Divisions 1 - 6, IGS will be giving 10 "Best of " awards this year.)

#### **Children's Division Awards:**

- The top five (5) entries in each Class. (If the entries merit that placement)
- All children will receive a ribbon: Either a 1st thru 5th place or a participant.
- Best of Children's Level Awards: Will be selected from Division 7's 1st place winners in each level. One (1) award will be given in level #1, #2, #3 and #4.
- Best of School, Youth, Group Awards: Will be selected from all of Division 8's 1st place winners. One (1) award will be given to the most outstanding gallery.

IGS has sent our stance to AGS regarding fractal burning, as of October 21, 2017.

"The Indiana Gourd Society states that the Society does not condone, endorse, nor encourage fractal burning. The IGS supports the stand taken by the American Association of Woodturners and the American Gourd Society. Furthermore, the IGS will not accept the **selling of** or **display of** gourds, at either exhibitions nor competitions gourds, that demonstrate the application of fractal burning. Karen K. #### What does this mean to you.

**DO NOT** bring to sell or enter into competition any gourds that have had fractal burning applied to them. These gourds will not be allowed at our state show.

### How To Measure Gourd(s) For Competition

2. Longest (with less than 4" of curve)

### 1. <u>Circumference</u>

Measured at the gourd's widest point, when standing in an upright position.


The imaginary straight line runs from the blossom

end to the stem protrusion of the gourd, stem not

## Longest Measurement Imaginary Straight Line Maximum Curve

#### 3. Height (measured two ways)

The longest measurement applies.

- 1.) Measure from the blossom end to the stem protrusion with the gourd's curvature.
- 2.) Measure at highest point when the gourd sits upright, stem not included


#### 4. Longest Measurement


Must have no more than a four (4) inch total curvature. To test this, measure gourd's length from the stem center to the blossom center at the opposite end of the gourd.

#### 5. <u>Width</u>

Measured at widest point when gourd sits upright.

### **Glossary of Terms - for Indiana Show Purposes**

#### Dried Gourds

<u>Dried Gourds</u>	
Clean Stem	washed stem with skin and dirt removed from the crevices, end trimmed
Assortment of Gou	rds - gourds of various sizes, shapes and varieties
Dried Gourd	water has entirely evaporated leaving a lightweight shell
Freak Growth	deformity of gourd that occurred naturally in nature, (no curly handle dippers)
Hand Trained	manipulation of growth to achieve a specific shape
Identical Gourds	same size, shape, color/hue and variety
Floral Design	
Base	platform or low stand that may/may not be permanently attached, no plastic
	rs - flowers constructed from gourds with/without other dried natural material
Crafting Technique	
Beading	beads and beading techniques used in decorating (plastic, glass, or natural beads allowed)
Burnt Gourd	burned with flame
Carving/Gouging	removing outer shell of gourd, not going completely through gourd
Coloring	using any natural/manufactured agent changing the natural color

Coloring Agent	substance used to change the natural color of the gourd
Cutting	penetrates the entire wall of the gourd (as with a saw or other tool)
Decoupage	material glued onto gourd and covered with a preservative
	g - beading stitch work incorporating small holes drilled into gourd shell
Fiber Art	any strands of fiber or wire elements to embellish a gourd as in lacing,
	weaving, coiling, netting, knotting, wrapping, stapling, plating, and others
Filigree	delicate ornamental cut work
Huichol Beading	beads embedded in wax
Inlay/Mosaic	the application of a secondary material into/on a section of a gourds surface
Pyrocutting	cut going completely through gourd by burning
Pyrography	burn on surface to form a design not going through gourd

- Gourds may have been grown in 2009 to 2018.
- Manipulating work must have been performed by exhibitor.
- Gourd must be dried, green cleaned preferred, with clean stem attached.
- Dried gourd entries must have no finish.

#### Class JS -1 Corkscrew. Class JS -2 Knotted. Class JS -3 Grown in a mold.

**NOTE:** After IGS judging, the three (3) 1st place entries will be judged together for competition at AGS level. The winning exhibitor is eligible for and responsible for the AGS competition and documentation. See AGS rules at http://www.americangourdsociety.org

### Division 1 — Memorial Division — 1 entry per person per class

**Division 1** - Stands as a memorial to those who have helped the society in educating the public with their unique talents, designs, manipulations, crafting and art work on gourds. **Division 1 General Requirements:**

- Gourds must be dried and cleaned with skin removed.
- Crafting and artistic work must be performed by exhibitor.
- Purchased gourds may be used.
- Gourd stems left on must be cleaned and finished to complement design.
- If gourd is cut open, the interior must complement the design.
- No plastic items to be used, except beads and flower stems.
- Gourd(s) MUST predominate.

#### **Jim Story Floral Design - Memorial**

Jim Story was a world renowned gourd legend. He was an IGS charter member and founder, a gentlemanly gardener, an experimenter, a teacher, the first manipulator and molder of gourds and a floral gourd designer. In Jim's honor, IGS has created an art competition category: Jim Story Memorial Class—Jim and Jane Story Creative Floral Design.





Class MD-A Jim & Jane Story Creative Floral Design, a creative floral design, using any natural materials. <u>Gourd(s) MUST predominate</u>. Exhibitor to supply a backdrop. (see page 14 for requirements.) <u>This class MUST be pre-registered by April 15.</u>

#### Joe Lee - Memorial -

Joe "Gourdy" Lee was a friend, lecturer, artist, teacher, student, and advisor. Joe was always a positive influence in the IGS and at our shows. Joe gave freely of his time to demonstrate what he loved to do - wood burning (Pyrography). He was always happy to share his wood burning techniques on small jewelry gourds and the Hawaiian quilt patterns on cannon ball gourds. In Joe's honor, IGS has created an art competition category:

### Division 2 - Dried Gourd - 2 entries per person per class

#### **Division 2 General Requirements:**

- Division 2 ALL compete on an equal basis.
- Contact the Show Committee if you would like to exhibit an educational display.
- Gourds must be grown by exhibitor.
- Pay particular attention to the use of the words either, or, and.
- Gourd circumference will not be considered, except where noted.

#### Exhibited gourds must adhere to the following:

1) be dried and cleaned with skin removed.

2) stem must be clean if attached.

#### 3) REQUIRED: A 3" X 5" CARD PRINTED WITH GOURD TYPE (I.E. APPLE, LUFFA), BY EXHIBITOR.

4) have no finish, except where noted.

#### For Classes 1 - 17, use letter (D) before class numbers 1 - 17 on Exhibit Entry Form

#### Hardshell (Lagenaria)

- **Class 1** Three (3) large gourds of different varieties, each eighteen (18) inches or more in either height or width.
- **Class 2** Three (3) medium gourds of different varieties, each more than ten (10) inches in height or width, but less than eighteen (18) inches in height or width.
- **Class 3** Three (3) small gourds, of different varieties, each less than ten (10) inches in height and width.
- Three (3) gourds of different varieties, chosen to demonstrate different shapes & sizes. Class 4
- Three (3) gourds of same variety, each should be the same shape, size, and hue/color. Class 5
- Class 6 Smallest hardshell gourd, measured in height, width, and circumference combined.
- Largest hardshell gourd, measured in height, width, and circumference combined. Class 7
- Class 8 Longest hardshell gourd, with less than four (4) inches of curve in the gourd.
- Class 9 Most outstanding specimen gourd, with or without a hole for seed removal.

#### **Ornamental** (Cucurbita)

- **Class 10** Five (5) gourds of same variety, each the same shape, size & hue/color.
- Class 11 Five (5) gourds of different varieties to demonstrate different shapes and sizes.
- Class 12 Smallest ornamental gourd, measured in height, width, and circumference combined. (includes ball Luffa).
- Class 13 Three (3) gourds of identical variety, cleaned, cylindrical Luffa or ball Luffa gourds.
- **Class 14** One (1) gourd, longest cylinder Luffa gourd.

#### **Miscellaneous Dried Gourds**

- Class 15 Other manipulated gourds.
- Class 16 One natural freak/deformity of nature. (Curly handle dippers not allowed)
- Class 17 Undecorated (rim scalloping allowed) gourd bowl containing a single or several different varieties of clean, whole undecorated gourds. A clear finish may be used.

### Division 3 - Botanicals - 2 entries per person per class

#### Division 3 - is open to Novice, Intermediate, Advanced, and Master Levels. **Division 3 General Requirements:**

- Design size maximum : Forty-eight (48") inches high by twenty-eight (28") inches wide by thirty (30") inches deep.
- Gourd does not have to be grown by exhibitor.
- All plant material must be live, except where noted.
- Plant material of all types may be used: bulbs, herbs, perennials, annuals, vines, etc.
- Plant material must be planted directly into the gourd container -- no liners or pots of any kind are to be used inside the gourd.
- A sealer may be used on the inside of the gourd, but is not necessary. ٠
- All planters/containers are to be gourds.
- Construction may be from more than one gourd.
- Gourd pieces may be added.
- If decorated, any technique(s) may be used.
- A wooden base on a gourd container is allowed; however, gourd base preferred.
- No plastic may be used except for flower stems and where noted.
- **GOURD(S) MUST PREDOMINATE!**

Class 18 Tabletop Gourd Planter Containing Plant(s) Of Your Choice.

- Class 19 Three (3) handcrafted gourd flowers, in a gourd vase/container. Any technique or combination may be applied for both flowers and vase. Floral tape may be used to cover flower "stems."
- Class 20 A table display, using gourds and fresh or dried natural plant materials.

Additional items allowed may include a small number of decorative pieces, such as fabric flags, ceramic/wooden statues, shells, pine cones, unlighted candles, etc. Plastic items, silk flowers, ribbons, and holiday themes are not allowed. Gourds must predominate!

Class 21 One (1) hanging wreath/swag/garland of any natural material but not limited to vines, straw, grass, twigs, pine needles, etc. The natural decorative materials are to be 75% gourd or gourd pieces, including Luffa. The wreath/swag/garland is not to exceed a space 48" high x 28" wide x 30" deep. Exhibitor must supply a hanging device. (See requirements on Page 14.) Manufactured materials, including ribbon, not allowed.

Class 22 "My Way - Floral." Any botanical design not listed above.



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### Division 4 - Floral Design - 2 entries per person per class

Division 4 - is open to Novice, Intermediate, Advanced, and Master Levels. **Division 4 General Requirements:** 

- THESE CLASSES ARE PRE-REGISTERED ONLY! MUST BE POSTMARKED BY APRIL 15.
  - **NO WALK-INS ALLOWED!** .
  - Designs to be exhibitor's own work. Gourd containers may be re-entered with different . designs. Use of a base is allowed in all classes. No plastics!
  - Gourd containers may be crafted of one or more gourds and/or purchased by exhibitor, • except where noted.
  - Designs may contain gourd(s) as design material.
  - **Design size maximum:** Forty-eight (48") inches high by twenty-eight (28") inches wide by thirty (30") inches deep. Except where noted.
  - Staging options: Must be supplied by exhibitor, if needed.
    - A. Freestanding backdrop size maximum: Forty-eight (48") inches high by thirty-six (36") inches wide, with wings no more than fourteen (14") inches wide.
    - B. Hanging device size maximum: Forty-eight (48") inches high by thirty-six (36") inches wide by thirty (30") inches deep.
  - ٠ Any plant material, including handcrafted gourd flowers, may be used.
  - No plastic, silk, or other manufactured floral materials may be used, except for flower ٠ stems and where noted.
  - The exhibitor will place his own design in assigned space. The show committee may • move designs to improve the look of the show.

Class 23 Design using <u>all fresh plant material</u> in any finished gourd container.

- Class 24 Design using all green, fresh plant material in any finished gourd container.
- Class 25 Design using all dried, treated or painted plant material in any finished gourd container.
- **Class 26** A hanging design, any natural material in any finished gourd container.

Exhibitor supplies hanging device. Backdrop is optional. (See requirements above).

- Class 27 Creative Floral Design, A creative floral design, using any natural materials, in any finished gourd container. Backdrop is optional. (See requirements above).
- Class 28 Creative Floral Design, A creative floral design using silk flowers only, in any finished gourd container (no plastic except flower stems). Backdrop is optional. (See requirements above).
- **Class 29** Creative Floral Gourd Container Only, A creative gourd floral container only, using any technique with or without waterproofing.

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### Division 5 - Arts & Crafts - 2 entries per person per class Section A - Basic Technique

Section A - The purpose is to create well-crafted, artistic gourd art. Balance and harmony of design will be considered, as well as creativity in gourd usage and technical expertise.

Division 5 - Section A - is open to Novice, Intermediate, Advanced, and Master Levels.

#### Section A - General Requirements:

## Gourds may be whole, cut or nearly whole, with or without other techniques or embellishments, except where noted.

- All crafting and artistic work must be performed by exhibitor, <u>except where noted</u>.

- If gourd is cut open, the interior must complement the design.
- No plastic items to be used, except beads and flower stems.
- In classes referring to a "whole gourd," the shell must be intact and uncut.
- Any technique(s) allowed.
- All materials necessary to make the object functional to be supplied by exhibitor.
- Object may be powered by batteries.
- Candles incorporated into the design must not be lit, unless battery operated.
- Electrical items may be lighted during judging, if UL tag is visible and electricity is available.
- Gourd(s) MUST predominate!

#### **Functional Birdhouse/Feeder/Waterer** (decorated or undecorated)

#### Class 46 - 47 - Requirements:

- House must hang
- No perch
- Drainage and vent holes required (Hanger holes are not considered vent holes.)
- Entry Hole must be cut out
- Class 46 Functional Bird House. <u>Decorated</u>, hole size of choice.

- Class 52 Gourd Musical instrument (must be functional).
- Class 53 Gourd Lamp, shade or base. <u>Required: a 3"x 5" telling what part is gourd.</u>
- Class 54 Gourd Luminary and/or Oil Lamp.
- Class 55 Gourd Hat.
- Class 56 Undecorated and/or decorated dipper, cut open to look like dipper.
- Class 57 Gourd Bowl and/or Container.
- Class 58 Gourd Basket with handle.
- Class 59 Gourd Pull. A gourd attached to a pull for a light/fan/etc.
- Class 60 Gourd Vase.

### Division 5 - Arts & Crafts - 2 entries per person per class Section C - Arts & Crafts

#### Division 5 - Section C - is open to Novice, Intermediate, Advanced, and Master Levels. Section C - General Requirements:

- All crafting and artistic work must be performed by exhibitor, except where noted.
- Purchased gourds may be used.
- Gourd stems left on must be cleaned and finished to complement design.
- If gourd is cut open, the interior must complement the design.
- No plastic items to be used, except beads and flower stems.
- In classes referring to a "whole gourd," the shell must be intact and uncut.
- Any technique(s) allowed.
- All materials necessary to make the object functional to be supplied by exhibitor.
- Object may be powered by batteries.
- Candles incorporated into the design must not be lit, unless battery operated.
- Electrical items may be lighted during judging, if UL tag is visible and electricity is available.
- Gourd(s) MUST predominate!

Class 61 Gourd Seed Art. Anything goes, 50% of visible entry must utilize gourd seeds. Class 62 Toy.

- Class 63 Doll or Human Figure. Constructed from single or multiple gourds.
- **Class 64** Creature or Animal. Constructed of single or multiple gourds.
- Class 65 Rain Stick. (Must be functional) <u>Required: a 3"X5" identifying contents of</u> rain stick.
- Class 66 Christmas: Santa/Father Christmas.
- Class 67 Christmas: Hanging Christmas Ornament.
- Class 68 Christmas: Christmas Decoration. (Any item except classes 66 or 67).
- Class 69 Halloween Decoration.
- Class 70 Easter Decoration.
- Class 71 Any Holiday Item. (Other than Halloween, Easter, or Christmas).
- Class 72 Miscellaneous Gourd Use A Miniature Gourd Item. Gourd and embellishments must be two (2) inches or less in any direction, and replicate a larger item. Jewelry and holiday items not allowed in this class. Stem, if present, and stands will <u>not</u> be included in two (2) inch measurement.
- Class 73 "Gourds in other Media" Item. An art/craft item which is not made of gourd, but has a gourd subject or theme—such as painting, sketch, photograph, writing, beadwork, lathed gourd shapes, quilt, embroidery, stained glass, leather tooling, pottery, etc. <u>This class is Pre-Registered ONLY!</u> <u>Registration must be postmarked by April 15.</u>
- Class 74 Western, South Western, and other Ethnic Theme.
- Class 75 Doodling.
- Class 76 "My Way Crafts." Any <u>TECHNIQUE NOT IDENTIFIED</u> in Class 30 to Class 75. <u>Required: a 3" X 5 " card explaining your technique.</u>
- Class 77 Theme Gourd by Single Artist. Any set of techniques is acceptable.
- Class 78 Theme Gourd by Multiple Artists. Any set of techniques are acceptable. Item should be entered under one artist's name. <u>Required: a 3" X 5" card</u> <u>listing each artist and their contribution must be displayed</u> with gourd (turned face down for judging).

### Division 6 - Gallery - 2 entries per person per class

Class 79 - 80 - are open to Novice, Intermediate, Advanced, and Master Levels.

Class 81 - Gourd Art may be from mixed levels and these galleries compete on an equal basis. <u>Division 6 General Requirements:</u>

#### THESE CLASSES ARE PRE-REGISTERED ONLY! MUST BE POSTMARKED BY APRIL 15. NO WALK-INS ALLOWED!

- Class 81 Group or Family Gourd Gallery. Create a special gallery of gourd art from two (2) or more people's work. <u>Maximum size: 48" high by 36" wide by 30" deep</u>. Exhibitor must supply staging. Gourds may have been previously exhibited, but not in this Gallery. <u>A 3" X 5" card listing each artist and contribution must be displayed</u> with gallery (turned face down for judging).

### **Division 7 and 8 General Requirements:**

- Must be Child's own work, with minimal Adult assistance.
- You may have up to (2) entries per child or group, per Class #.
- No plastic used, except for beads and flower stems.
- Gourd pieces may be added.
- Stems to be cleaned if attached.
- Use of a base is allowed in all classes. No plastic.
- Required: a 3"x 5" card to explain—"What is your creation?"

### Vendor Policy - IGS State Show - 2019

The Indiana Gourd Society, Inc. will not create a policy that will eliminate any vendor from demonstrating or selling any Brand Name merchandise or determine any price structure for merchandise sold, thereby eliminating competition between vendors. This has been the position of the Indiana Gourd Society, Inc. in the past and shall continue to be in the future.

**IGS Board of Directors** 

Location and Booth Space:

- Dry Gourd Vendors (with cleaned gourds) will be allowed inside, if space is available.
- Outside Space, approximately 16' x 24'.
- Inside Space, approximately 10' x 10'.
- Booth locations, assigned by the committee according to show layout. Specific requests will be considered, but cannot be guaranteed.
- **Demonstrations** in the booth are limited to the confines of the booth. Demonstrations must be completed during show hours, must not produce a "make it-take it" item, or charge a fee.
- Manning the booth is the responsibility of the person applying for the booth space. <u>Vendor is responsible for staffing booth during show hours.</u> As a courtesy to neighboring vendors, <u>no booth is to be left unattended during show hours.</u>
- Tables inside must be skirted to the floor on all audience sides.
- <u>Permits, Merchandise and Sales:</u> Each vendor is responsible for all Federal/Indiana taxes (forms at Dept. of Revenue, Indianapolis, Ind.)
- Merchandise must be at least seventy-five percent (75%) gourd and/or gourd-related. Any other merchandise and/or vendors will be by IGS invitation only.
- NO SALE of fractal burned gourds, plastic items or artificial flowers is permitted.
- **Committee reserves the right** to reject and/or restrict vendor due to space constraints, condition and/or quality of sale merchandise, sale of inappropriate items for this show or sub-standard booth appearance.
- All imported sale gourds must be clearly marked, "Imported from \_\_\_\_\_" (specify country).
- Sales begin after your booth has been set up and continues throughout show hours.
- <u>Teardown</u>: Vendors may teardown after 4:00 PM on Saturday. Merchandise sell-out does <u>NOT</u> constitute a reason to dismantle your booth or remove merchandise prior to the designated teardown time.
- <u>Security:</u> Reasonable security will be provided for all show participants by the Indiana Gourd Society, Inc. and Fulton Co. Historical Society. (*See security disclaimer on page 6.*)






