With the harvest season comes the Fall Membership Meeting and Festival to be held again at the Tippecanoe County fair grounds in Lafayette Indiana. The fair ground is found on South route 25 or also called Teal road. The fair grounds are very easy to find coming from any direction. As you are going South on Route 25 the fair ground in on the right side, Signs will be posted. The show is located in the Home Ec. Building on North side of grounds. The Date of the show is November 10, 2007.

The show will open to the public at 9:00 a.m. Eastern time and all vendors must be in place. The Membership meeting is planned to start at around 3:00 p.m. depending on crowd.



Quick Jips Do your gourd pictures always come out with flash "hot-spots", shadows, or poor alignment that ruin an other-

wise perfect picture? We won't guarantee this solution will work for everything you want to photograph, however, it could be adapted to perform much the same for small to large objects. Obtain a large cardboard box approximately 2.5 ft X 2.5 ft X 3.0 ft tall. You will also need an 18" wide roll of heavy duty aluminum foil, double backed tape, plumbers putty or clay, and two small "directed light", preferably on adjustable height stands.

Cut the full front side of the box out and save the side. Crinkle a strip of aluminum foil that will fit one side of the box. This should not be a tightly wadded piece of foil, but you do want numerous creases in the foil. Now pull the foil back into a sheet without pressing out the crinkles. Check fit the aluminum foil to one side of the box. Place double backed tape to outline the approximate area of the foil and then run an "X" from corner to corner. Remove the protective coating of the tape and place your crinkled foil, bright side out, on the wall of the box. Repeat this process for all sides, including the "front" piece. Use a large plain piece of contrasting colored artists card stock as a backing or under the object and shoot either directly into the box from the front, or shoot directly down on the item. Use modeling clay or plumbers putty to help hold the object.

Place your lights to point at the sides of the box. Take your photograph by centering the item in the viewer. If all of the item isn't there pull back and view again, you can always crop the image later. Upload to your computer. View the photograph for "hot spots", shadows, and proper alignment. If any errors, move the lights or the camera and try again. This should leave you with a fairly reflection free and shadow free photograph. If using a standard film camera, scan your photos with resolution set at least to 600 dpi and save as "your_photo_original" and keep as an original. Work only on a copy of a photo for cropping etc.. If you don't have a good application to do so, download the "free" GIMP (Graphic Image Manipulation Program) application from the Internet (www.gimp.org—read the download and installation instructions—multiple modules required). This package has about 80-85 % of what PhotoShop™ has for cropping, editing, sizing, etc. for photographs.

<u>FOURTH Notice:</u> Tendril Moving to Electronic Delivery—Get your info in if you want paper copies mailed!

As you may have read in the last issue of the Tendril, the cost of printing and postage have forced us to go to electronic delivery. This has several advantages: you'll get the issue about 2-3 weeks sooner, and it will be IN COLOR.

There is a new area on the website at www.indianagourdsociety.org called **MemberLogin**. When you click here, you'll see a page with a login and password. **Your login is the ID number on the top** line of your Tendril label. Your password is your zip code (5 digits only). You'll be able to see back issues of the Tendril, and other information for members only. We'll still print a copy and mail it to you - but it will be black and white. This change will take effect with the first issue in 2008, as we get the bugs worked out of the system.
