

2008 Roll Of Honor

The charter members who founded the Indiana Gourd Society decided to show their appreciation to those individuals who went above and beyond their volunteer efforts for the society. This passion for the growing, crafting and promotion of gourds is shown in their efforts. Individuals who have clearly demonstrated this work in any area of the gourd society may be nominated for the Roll of Honor. All nominees must be current or past members of the society. Any current IGS member may make a nomination.

Nominations for the Roll of Honor are to be sent to the secretary of IGS on an $8 \sim X$ 11" sheet of paper. The Executive Board will review the nominations. If necessary, the Executive Board will appoint a committee to narrow the number of nominees. If a committee is needed to reduce the number of nominations, they will return to the Executive Board a smaller list of nominees. The executive board will then select the honorees from the smaller list. The Executive Board will have the final decision regarding how many individuals there will be.

Nominating instructions will appear in The Tendril and on the IGS website.

Those found worthy by the Executive Board will then have their names engraved on the Roll of Honor plaque and will be introduced at the dinner of the annual Indiana Gourd Show. On a piece of 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ " X 11" sheet of paper write or type why you believe your nominee should be added to the Roll of Honor. Please site specific activities this individual was involved with.

Pure Seed Project

This is a program of the Indiana Gourd Society for producing genetically pure high quality seed that will assure the purchaser of IGS seed the highest probability of growing adapted true to type gourd varieties.

Control of pollination by hand pollinating or growing in isolation thru multiple generations allows selection for improving trueness to type of varieties and seeds with homo genius sets of genes.

To date the program which is a work in progress is involved with over 20 varieties—some in their 1st managed year and several thru the 4th generation.

Our aim and goal is to reach and continue beyond 7 generations to have 99 plus% genetically "pure seeds" produced and sold by IGS.

State Fair Information

Entry rules and regulations can be found on-line at http://www.in.gov/statefair/fair/index.html. Once at that page click on the navigation link "Competitive Exhibitors" and then the "Open Class Handbook".

Look in the list for Dept 112, Ag/Hort – Part 1. (Go to page # 15 of 25 on the PDF file or to page 245 of the handbook.) That is the section of a PDF file containing the rules for "GO GOURDS". The actual Entry Form is lower down on that page – look for the same Department info. PLEASE, do NOT use this article as a basis for anything concerning your official entries. GO TO the State Fair site posted above and read the RULES!!

Check in time is on Sunday, Aug 5, 1-4 PM and Monday Aug 6, 8 AM through Sunday Aug 7, 8 AM. Judging begins Aug 7 at 9 AM

Classes = Fresh, Dried, and Crafted. There many items in each class so check them thoroughly as the rules are strictly adhered to at the Fair. This means that you MUST read the rules and adhere to them.

One entry fee is \$30 if your entry is postmarked by July 1, 2008 and this single entry allows you entry of up to 250 exhibits. Late entries will be accepted if postmarked July 2 through July 30, however, an additional \$25 is required for ALL late entries.

Exhibit release is Sunday, August 19, 9-11 PM - NO VEHICLE TRAFFIC - only those exhibits that can be carried to the exhibitors cars will be released. Also, Monday, August 20, 9 AM (no ticket required).

We only received about half of the entries show up that were signed for on the entry forms at the 2007 State Fair. We have a large number of people come through the area during the entire show, so this is the place to show your wares, especially for beginners.

And, if you're interested in getting into the Fair with "free parking" all you have to do is sign up to volunteer for a four hour stint at our booth — either demonstrating your talent or helping with Seed Sales, Ways & Means, and talking to the public. This is another good place for beginners to learn a LOT about "gourding"

Quick Tips If you happen to open a gourd that is filled with soft, fluffy, off-white "cotton," pull the fiber out gently with your hand. There will still be soft remnants clinging to an otherwise nice hard mother of pearl finish. What to do? ery carefully scrape away the soft fibers, and underneath the dullness is hard shiny mother of pearl. In places, it may not be perfectly smooth. The surface may have been gouged or coming off in layers, still pretty, but a looking a bit fly-away and imperfect. Mix one part Elmer's glue to two parts water, and paint the inside with a foam brush. Doing so will put a hard finish on the softer white parts, tacking them down so they are not prone to further damage. The glue mixture will dry clear and shiny just like the "good" mother of pearl with no discoloration, and now you have a true gem on your hands.

Note: I cut open about fourteen of these this year. Had seen the mother of pearl before on rare occasions but never a gourd filled with the soft cottony fiber.

As you may have read in the last issue of the Tendril, the cost of printing and postage have forced us to go to electronic delivery. This has several advantages: you'll get the issue about 2-3 weeks sooner, and it will be IN COLOR.

There is a new area on the website at www.indianagourdsociety.org called **MemberLogin**. When you click here, you'll see a page with a login and

password. Your login is the ID number on the top line of your Tendril label. Your password is your zip code (5 digits only). You'll be able to see back issues of the Tendril, and other information for members only. We'll still print a copy and mail it to you - but it will be black and white. This change will take effect with the first issue in 2008, as we get the bugs worked out of the system.

Harvesting Info for IGS!

We need to have members report back to IGS about how their seeds and plants performed. Did you get what you expected from the germination? Did your plants produce the type of gourd which you expected from the category of seed you purchased and planted? Did you let nature pollinate the plants or did you hand pollinate? Were other types of gourds grown nearby?

Feedback from members is the only way we can assure that our seeds are producing the correct fruit. The feedback will be used by the Seeds chair and the Pure Seed Project chair to determine whether we should actually keep the existing batch of seeds or consider using seed from other sources.

A new area on our Web Site will be generated "soon", but with no firm date set yet. This will allow member/growers to input their information and submit it into a database that we will use to collect and retain information from all sources about the viability and reliability of our seeds.

As in all other IGS efforts, this will take our MEM-BERS doing the volunteer work of taking time and entering their data. Phil and I have discussed the format of the database and input form to make this as painless as possible. Hopefully this will automate a lot of the entries with the user having to input two items from drop down menus, the Problem Area, and the Gourd Variety. The member will then have to type in the information concerning the problem itself.

2008 Membership Meet

Arrangements have been made with the Miami County Fairgrounds for a site and date to hold our May 2008 Spring Membership meeting. Saturday May 3 is the scheduled date and their 4-H Project building was selected.

The building exhibit floor space available exceeds 18,000 sq ft. Bathroom facilities are included and there is a kitchen. Food service will be provided by the 4-H staff with sandwiches (hamburger, tenderloin, barbecue) etc.

Friday night set up will be allowed. Tables are available (excluding their new white tables). Outside vendor set up space is available

Plenty of parking area near the building is convenient for visitors. RV hook up is available at \$20 -- water plus electric is included and waste disposal is available.

QuickTip—Raised Beds – Cheap, Fast and Easy
We made four small raised beds about five feet in diameter by making circles of plastic garden edging, the kind with the rolled rim, which we riveted together at the seam and fastened to the ground with tent pegs. We have been using them for seven or eight years, and they have held up well. They were especially nice when I had to move my gourd beds from their original location due to a neighbor's
