For both festival/membership meetings there will be no parking nor admission fees. We'll have workshops, a vendor/display area, auction, and membership meetings at 3:30 p.m.

A seed harvest day will take place on February 1 and seed packaging day on March 14, both at 10 a.m. (EST) at the Thorntown Public Library, Thorntown, IN.

PATCH NEWS

Eight members of the Sugar Creek Gourd Patch met at the Thorntown Public Library, 124 N. Market St., Thorntown, IN on December 4, 2013 to work on basic chip carving on gourds as taught by patch members Beth Morris and Monta Taylor. Both gourders had participated in a class taught in early May at the Indiana Gourd Show by Florida's James Bennett They displayed their completed bird houses made from martin house gourds and talked participants through practice cuts. Leather dyes and gel stains were added for additional color. The Sugar Creek Gourd Patch meets every first and third Wednesday from 6-8 p.m. If no joint project is on the agenda, members work on individual projects. However, on December 18, the holes for bird houses were cut and pine cone pieces were affixed as roof shingles.

In November, Sandra Townsend, Sally Mohringer, and others in the group brought in their own tools and showed how they are used; the patch also worked on making shakeree necklaces out of small gourds. In January (NO Jan 1 meeting!), February, and March, the sessions will be devoted to individual projects and helping absentee members catch up on missed lessons. On April 2 and 16, Ardith Bowles will teach weaving on gourds, and on May 7 and 21 Beth Morris will teach how to make giraffes from dipper and pear gourds. One Way To Start Seeds

- Take a half gallon paper milk carton and poke some small drain holes in the bottom of it (DO NOT CUT OFF THE TOP OF THE CARTON), then fill it with 3" to 4" of potting soil.
- After socking [soaking] your seeds in water overnight, take 2 or 3 of them and plant them no more than ½" deep or as deep as they are long in each of your cartons.
- Keep the potting soil moist (NOT WET) and in a warm place until the seeds sprout and grow till they have 4-6 or more leaves on them.
- After danger of frost has passed transfer the gourd plants carton and all to your garden. Dig a hole large enough to hold your carton and deep enough to have the potting soil inside the carton at the same level as the soil outside the carton.
- Carefully cut off the bottom of the carton (DO NOT CUT OFF TO [TOO] HIGH UP THE SIDE OF THE CARTON) and place carton and gourd plant in the hole. Move soil in around carton.
- By planting carton and gourd plant together, you place a protective barrier around the plant to protect it from wind, hot sun, and insects.
- For each carton you plant take a 1 gallon plastic carton and cut just the bottom off of it. These can be used to place over the top of your gourd plants in case of late frost, and they will work as a mini greenhouse also.
- After your gourd plants have become well established, you can cut off the carton at ground level and discard it.
