PATCH NEWS

Central Indiana Patch (Diane Werblo, contact)

In September Mac McCrary taught Cathy Burton, Donna Franklin, RoJene Gillentine, Jean Long, Mary Johnson, Suzy Kish, Ann Stankiewicz, Sandra and Tim Townsend, and Diane Werblo to spray paint through lace/netting. We produced some interesting gourds! Tim's looked like a small striped watermelon. RoJene had copper and blue lace with interesting fades. We'd also like to thank Carol and Jerry Thomas for *bringing us* 3 bags of gourds to use as we wish. (It was especially nice that most of the were cleaned already!) In October we made Halloween and Mexican Day of the Dead decorations. I exhibited the double-sided gourd I bought at the IGS auction as an example.

Sugar Creek Gourd Patch & Thorn Tree Gourd Patch (Karen Niemeyer, contact)

Both of these gourd patches meet at the Thorntown Public Library. For the months of October and November are meeting together and only twice a month at 6-8:00 p.m., on the first and third Wednesdays. They will be deciding whether or not to resume meeting on the second and fourth Wednesdays. On October 5 Annette Knox taught acrylic painting of a skeleton on negative space over a pumpkin; these were painted on Lump in Neck gourds (see page 6). In September the group painted ghost over pumpkin on large bottle gourds; this class was also taught by Annette and twelve members completed their projects. Karen Niemeyer has loaned hers, along with 23 other painted gourds from her personal collection to a local art teacher. He sent photos of his second and third grade students' paintings of a bird house gourd in his classroom (see below), and the Thorntown patches have given him 302 gourds of the 530 he would like in order to let each of his students in grades K-6 paint on a gourd. Gourds were given with the stipulation that he enter at least 50 completed ones in the IGS May state show. On November 2 Denise Bechtold will teach the groups how to make a drum necklace. IMPORTANT NOTICE REGARDING SEED PRODUCTION

Across the country there are very few gourd seed producers available anymore. Indiana Gourd Society is one of the few left. At this time I am doing most of the work to keep the Pure Seed Project going. I cannot continue doing the majority of the work involved by myself. If I cannot find at least two other individuals who want to get involved and learn to do this and are willing to work with me on a regular basis then I am afraid we will have to discontinue this service as a Society.

What is involved:

- Growing individual type gourds in isolation or hand pollinating each type
- Removing and curing the seeds
- Testing seeds on a regular basis (1 X year)
- Packaging seeds for resale
- Selling seeds from home and other sources
- Tracking sales of seeds

If anyone would like to be involved with the process, please contact me as soon as possible. This could be a profitable business for someone who is willing to put their time into it.

Gourd Dust Blower, Homemade

Please Wear a dust mask when working on gourds.....as in cleaning, carving, cutting, burning, etc. Keeping your good gourd health is up to you.

To help you wear a dusk mask and keep it on, I am giving you instruction for my homemade **Gourd dust blower.** This blower should cost less than \$15 to make, depending on the pump size, air output and brand. Walmart type stores and pet shops sell the items needed. Listed below is what you will need and how to made it. See pictures.

Needs:

- 1. A small aquarium pump. (Diaphragm type, not underwater type, about 15gal size)
- 2. At least 3 feet of flexible (thin walled) tubing to fit pump outlet.
- 3. Paperclips, <u>small</u> or large. (or wire about the same gauge)
- 4. Rubber bands.

Paperclips:

- 1. Bend and straighten one end of paperclip.... leave the small end bent in the curve.
- 2. Put the straight end inside the tubing, leave the curved ends short end on outside of tubing
- 3. You may need to squeeze the curve closed some to keep it from falling out.

Rubber Bands:

- 1. Place the tubing end, with wire in it, down one side of the tool.
- 2. Use several rubber bands to attach tubing to the tool.

How it works:

- 1. Bend the wired tubing to follow the shape of tool.
- 2. Shape/adjust it to blow air towards where dust is created and the dust will blow away.

Hints:

- 1. Make several paperclip wires, one for each tool, then just switch wires. Save time, over bending and breakage.
- 2. If you do heavy carving, you may want a stronger pump. A 20gal or higher pump will work, but the \$\$\$ goes up.

Have a Gourd Day, blow the dust away and wear a dust mask.
