Indiana Gourd Society, Inc. Meeting of Directors and Officers June 22, 2019

President Loretta Pressel called the meeting to order at 2:28 p.m. in the Kokomo Public Library. Present were Loretta and Ron Pressel, Pat Moore, Phil Moorhead, Fran Bascom, Sandra Townsend, Karen Niemeyer, Diane Werblo, Mac McCrary, Ida Kennedy, and Sherry and Tom Benedict.

Congratulations were offered to Ida and Pat for articles in the recent AGS magazine.

The minutes of the March 16, 2019, meeting were approved by consensus.

The treasurer's report remains on Phil's desk and will be e-mailed. He provided a summary of 2006-2019 budgets and made recommendations for 2020. The budget will be e-mailed for a board vote so that it may be presented at the October 19 membership meeting. We continue to budget \$100 per patch but not all patches use the allocation.

Pat reported that there are 134 active households as members and 185 total memberships. She suggested that patches encourage participants to become members.

Diane and Sandra will be 2020 state show co-chairs, and Pat distributed a list of other show positions. Diane will ask whether or not two of her patch members will chair the Make-It-Take-It area.

The Indiana State Fair (Aug 2-18) was discussed, and Diane provided a worker schedule form. Spinner gourds, shards, pens/pencils, and coloring sheets were discussed. Karen will revise, per Mac's suggestion, and make copies of a gourd coloring bookmark. The question was raised whether or not we spend too much time with children and might need to focus more attention on their parents and adults. We should also provide them the IGS business card.

On Sept. 14 there will be a 10:00 a.m. meeting of the show committee to finalize items of concern. Ida made arrangements for the meeting to again be held at Kokomo Public Library, 1755 East Center Road, Kokomo.

The October 19 membership meeting will be held at 11:00 a.m. at the Thorntown Public Library, and Karen will be sure Rochester knows IGS will NOT be meeting there on October 19. The board will meet at 10:00 a.m. and may have to meet again after the membership meeting to complete necessary business. Karen is also to re-confirm that the state show will be at the Fulton County Historical Society site in Rochester on May 1-2, 2020, with setup on April 30.

Ron was identified as part of an audit committee and Phil will propose July dates for that work. Ron resigned from the audit committee as of June 29, 2019. Tom's name was mentioned as a possible member.

Karen agreed to serve as nominations chair and have a slate ready for the September 14 meeting. Tom's and Loretta's terms will expire Dec. 31, 2019.

The formation of an advisory council was discussed. The board may have such a council to assist and to vote on issues in order to provide advice to the board. Phil advised that the board does NOT need members' permission to form a council nor to determine who will be on it and how they may be removed. Phil moved that IGS start with full voting rights an advisory council consisting of the 6 IGS officers and 5 Directors; Diane seconded. The motion passed unanimously. Although there are eleven positions, a quorum would be five because two directors are also officers and are not allowed to vote twice.

For now, it was agreed to retain the Lebanon storage facility. It costs \$115/month for the climate- controlled space.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned at 4:23 p.m.
