PATCH NEWS

Sugar Creek Gourd Patches (Karen Niemeyer, contact)

The Patch meets at the Thorntown Public Library on the first and third Wednesdays from 2-4:00 p.m ET. There is generally no charge to participate but call Karen Niemeyer at 765-436-7348 to reserve a chair and supplies. On December 4 and 18 Denise Bechtold helped attendees make a gourd catcher toy using a dipper and egg gourd. There will not be a session on January 1, but on January 15 the group project will be a snowman gourd with the saying "Let it snow...someplace else." In February the projects will be Valentine-themed, with Easter the subject for March. In April the group will work with leaded stained glass patterns on cannonballs. Participants may work on their own projects instead of the group one. Questions should be directed to Karen at the library.

Central Indiana Patch (Diane Werblo, contact)

On Nov. 12 Diane Werblo and Mac McCrary gave an overview of gourd growing and crafting to an appreciative audience of Putnam County Master Gardeners. They asked good questions afterwards, and many came for a close look at the examples. (We won't mention the detour around the town that made us an hour late! They really should have warned us; it's been that way for two years.) In December Michelle Fife, Mary Johnson, Jean Long, Mac McCrary, Laura Taube, Sandra and Tim Townsend, and Diane Werblo were there. We got the springs for the Thunder Drums. A new source for springs is Vincent Swank at thundergourds.com/. "Drummers" showed what they had accomplished and asked questions about finishing the project. Others shared holiday ornament tips. We decided to move to Wednesdays. (GPAC, closed Sundays and Mondays, is often late opening on Tuesdays.) Due to weather problems in January, Mac McCrary will be teaching Basic Calligraphy on paper in February. In March it will be writing on gourds.

INDIANA GOURD SOCIETY MEMBERSHIP MEETING - October 19, 2024

[Report for approval at next meeting]

President Denise Bechtold called the meeting to order at 2:14 p.m.. at the Thorntown Public Library. There were 24 present.

Denise presented the Special Award certificates for the day's mini state show:

- Carl Abner green clean

- Michele Fife Most blue ribbons

Membership chair Pat Moore presented the membership report. As of October 16 there are 142 total memberships; in 2023 there were 143. There are 98 total active household memberships plus 17 household memberships that have 2 or more members in the household, and 27 complimentary memberships. Of these, 119 receive the Tendril electronically and 23 receive paper copies. Pat asked that patch leaders send her and the IGS treasurer the name and address of those attending patch sessions. Karen Niemeyer read a letter from Loretta Pressel updating the group on Loretta's and Ron's circumstances; many of the gourds available for purchase were donated by them. Long-time member Helen Parker and family members dropped in to view the show and visit with gourders.

The minutes of the October 21, 2023, membership meeting were approved, on a motion by Phil Moorhead and a second Diane Werblo.

Phil presented the treasurer's report; it will be filed for audit. There is a total of \$9556.22 in general spendable funds with all state and federal taxes and business forms filed. At the close of business for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2024, IGS had \$10,236.80 in the checking account and \$6,839.42 in the money market (savings) account. That totals \$17,056.22 compared to \$18,670.28 at the close of 2023. We have a \$5000 donation for education support and a \$2500 donation for Jim Story Award stipends, which results in the \$9556.22 in spendable funds. The Indiana State Fair still requires a two million dollar insurance policy in order for us to occupy a booth. In the fiscal year ending June 30, 2024, IGS had income of \$650 with a loss of \$2409.44, resulting in a net loss of \$1759.44. IGS can survive with its existing funds since it is no longer paying \$1800 annually for storage shed rental. There was discussion on how to improve membership and suggestions included targeting our promotions to younger people and other geographical areas. It was noted that IGS should assign someone to focus on this. There was discussion on postage costs and reliability of mail delivery.

For Officers' Reports president Denise noted that she is learning what is required in her position and will appreciate suggestions. 1st Vice President Helen Thomas is ill and was unable to attend; she plans to start backing off from gourd farm work. There was no 2nd vice president's report, and Pat had earlier provided the membership report.

Under Patch Reports Karen noted that the Sugar Creek patch varies from 2 to 10 participants who meet from 2-4:00 on the first and third Wednesdays at the library and that members can work on a group or an individual project. Linda's Patch report by Peggy Robertson noted that they include multiple generations and girlfriends and in addition to working on projects have been giving many gourd presentations in the area. Diane Werblo reported that the Central Indiana patch has asked Mac McCrary to teach calligraphy on gourds, plans to make thunder drums, and wants to host a Great Gourd Giveaway in the spring, not just in autumn. Greg Olson reported that the Bloomington patch that was started in July has 4 to 9 participants and is enjoying a variety of projects.

Under Old Business Diane gave the Indiana State Fair report and encouraged members to enter the fair and save money by receiving free passes. The IGS booth is half the size but more volunteers would be appreciated. Both the AgHort building and Coliseum feature gourds.

While Phil is storing the climate-sensitive IGS items, other boxes that were formerly in a rented storage shed are now in Karen's garage. She recommended an inventory be completed so that locations can be clarified.

The American Heritage Girls Partnership that was brought up at the last meeting was reviewed. Phil had taken the proposal to the American Gourd Society and it was noted that the group is not really an alternative to Girl Scouts but is a religious organization. IGS could lose its non-profit status if it partnered with the group. By consensus IGS members agreed to not partner.

Under New Business today's State Show was reviewed. There were 91 preregistered exhibits by 13 people and 12 walk-ins and 5 new people today. The 100+ entries was similar in number to the Idaho show that Phil attended in September. It appears that today's funds are \$189.00 from Ways & Means, more than \$187.00 from the donation box by dried gourds, and \$106.50 from food. Linda's Patch was applauded for doing a fantastic job providing food and drinks for the day.

On a motion by Greg Olson and a second by Penny Boyce, board members were unanimously elected for 2-year terms: Phil as Director 2 and Rosemary Hill as Director 4.

The question arose "what do people get for IGS membership?" This will need to be addressed if we have to ask for an increase in dues. It was agreed that patches may encourage membership but that participants are not required to become members in order to enjoy a patch. Patches may request \$100 to recover expenses but must provide receipts to Phil.

Diane encouraged smush painting after Pat noted that a lady wanted to know how to dip/marbleize gourds with nail polish, not paint.

Tendril articles are due NOW.

Updating of the IGS social media presence was suggested, and Phil will welcome suggestions. It was noted that Diane's Facebook page is individual but needs to be organizational.

Greg will work on creating a virtual patch (Zoom) for people who are outside our physical patch areas.

There being no further business, Karen moved and Diane seconded adjournment. The meeting adjourned at 3:50 P.M.
